Dr. Diana Fu is associate professor of political science at The University of Toronto, The Munk School of Global Affairs & Public Policy. She is also a non-resident fellow at Brookings Institution, a China Wilson Fellow, and a public intellectuals fellow at the National Committee on US-China Relations. Her research examines popular contention, state power, civil society, and diaspora activism and citizenship, with a focus on contemporary China. She is author of the award-winning book, "Mobilizing Without the Masses: Control and Contention in China" (Cambridge, 2018) which uncovers how weak citizens mobilize when they are not allowed to. She regularly delivers keynote lectures to governments, non-profits, and corporations. She holds a doctorate in politics and an MPHIL in development studies from Oxford University where she studied as a Rhodes Scholar.
